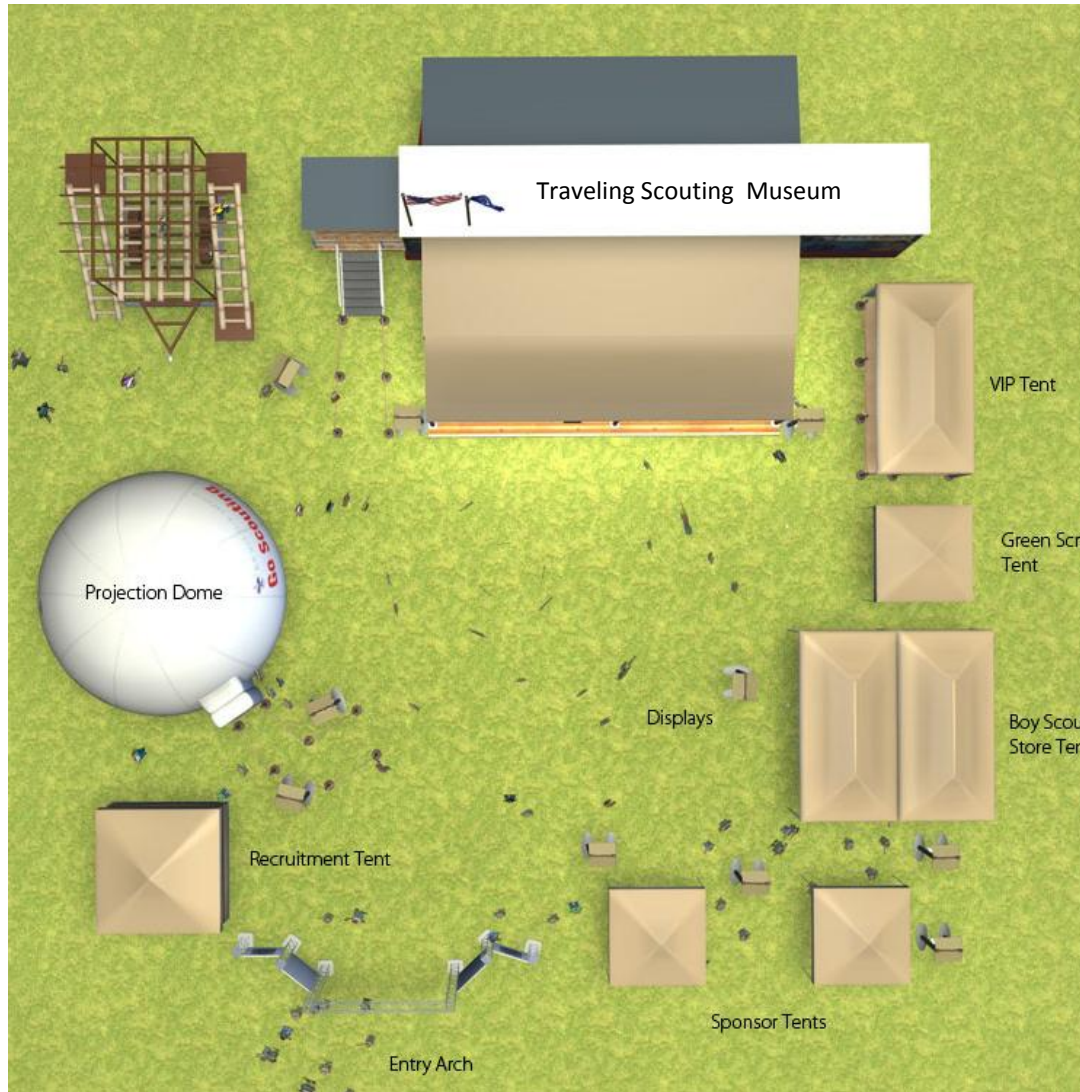

# Onsite Council Support (Exterior)



## Entry Archway

**Position Title:** Greeter

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 4 – 10 per shift

**Description:** Uniformed Scouts and Scouters greet guests at the entryway and give a brief overview of the campus experience.

**Special Considerations:** Try to recruit individuals that are comfortable speaking with both children and adults (Scouts and non-Scouts alike). Look for people who are both energetic and personable, including volunteers, Scouts, and Scouting alumni!

## Stage

**Position Title:** Various

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** Varies

**Description:** Gathers as many people as possible to observe and/or participate in fun stage activities.

**Special Considerations:** We can work with you to create a run of show that involves as many people as possible. Stage activities can include: Scout skill demonstrations like Knot Tying 101, recognition ceremonies, sing-alongs, skits, storytelling, and more!

# Onsite Council Support (Exterior)



## Recruitment Tent: Position 1

**Position Title:** Recruiter

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 4-6 per shift

**Description:** Uniformed Scouts and Scouters answer questions about Scouting, including how youth can join and how adults can get involved as volunteers.

**Special Considerations:** Recruit individuals who are very knowledgeable about the BSA and understand the programs, activities, and opportunities that are available in each of the represented councils.

## Recruitment Tent: Position 2

**Position Title:** Registration Greeter

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 3-4 per shift

**Description:** Distributes interest cards to potential youth members and volunteers.

**Special Considerations:** Enlist volunteers that are comfortable using a computer. This is a great assignment for those who prefer non-strenuous (seated) assignments.

# Onsite Council Support (Exterior)



## Projection Dome

**Position Title:** Greeter

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 2

**Description:** Uniformed Scouts and Scouters greet guests, manage the flow of the line, and educate people about Scouting while they wait their turn.

**Special Considerations:** Recruit volunteers that are comfortable with crowd control to manage the line into the dome.

## Ropes Course and Zip Line

**Position Title:** Spotter

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 2-4

**Description:** Spots children participating in the ropes course.

**Special Considerations:** There are no age requirements for this position; however, we do recommend asking responsible adults or older Scouts to spot children (ages 6-17) in harnesses.

# Onsite Council Support (Exterior)



## VIP Tent

**Position Title:** Greeter

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 3-4

**Description:** Greets special guests

**Special Considerations:** We recommend identifying individuals comfortable speaking to VIPs or who are personally acquainted with some of the dignitaries in your area.

## Green Screen

**Position Title:** Technician

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 3-4

**Description:** Facilitates the Green Screen Interaction

**Special Considerations:** We recommend recruiting people who are fairly technologically savvy for this position.

# Onsite Council Support (Interior)



## Traveling Scouting Museum: Position 1

**Position Title:** Line Greeter

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 2-3

**Description:** Greets guests at the museum entrance, manages the flow of the line, and educates guests about Scouting while they are waiting their turn.

**Special Considerations:** We recommend identifying personable individuals who are comfortable with crowd control.

## Traveling Scouting Museum: Position 2

**Position Title:** Museum Guide

**Recommended Volunteer Number:** 2-3

**Description:** Guides guests through the museum and answers guest questions.

**Special Considerations:** This could be a great opportunity to involve Scouting alumni or even the Scouts themselves. All guides should be friendly and able to talk about Scouting's past and its future.
