All campfire programs, run-ons, speeches, and skits must...

- be appropriate to all the audience (all ages!)
- display the standards and values that Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts organizations strive to achieve.
- never embarrass or demean anyone or any group of people.
- avoid jokes about religion, underwear, toilet paper, politics, cross-gender impersonations, water, *double entendres* or inside jokes
- uphold the foundations of the basic Scouting Mission Statements:

Boy Scout Mission:

The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

Girl Scout Mission:

Girl Scouting builds girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place.

- honor the scouting spirit of the Boy and Girl Scout Oath, Law and Promise values as responsible, participating citizens.
- be approved by the campfire committee prior to the Saturday auditions.

Remember:

If there is a hint that it is inappropriate, choose another skit, don't do it.
